PA 94-0600 During each academic year, schools must conduct a minimum of 3 school evacuation drills to address and prepare students and school personnel for fire incidents...One of the 3 school evacuation drills shall require the participation of the appropriate local fire department or district.
During each academic year, schools must conduct a minimum of one bus evacuation drill.
During each academic year, schools must conduct a minimum of one severe weather and shelter-in-place drill to address and prepare students and school personnel for possible tornado incidents and may conduct additional severe weather and shelter-in-place drills to account for other incidents, including without limitation earthquakes or hazardous materials.
Beginning in FY 10 schools must conduct a minimum of one law enforcement drill with participation of appropriate local law enforcement agency. May be done on days when students are not present.
